- ❖ The maintenance and continuous improvement of a documented Environmental Management System which complies with the requirements of ISO 14001:2015,

- ❖ Having the resources in place to educate, train and motivate employees to carry out tasks in an environmentally responsible manner and ensure that a continuous professional development strategy remains core to our business vision and values,
- ❖ Selection of constituent materials to support the design of products to enhance product performance within the built environment, taking the initiative to find creative ways to deliver the best possible business results,
- ❖ Evaluating fulfilment of the compliance obligations through both internal and external audits and correcting any non-conformities to further enhance environmental performance and supporting continuous improvement,
